

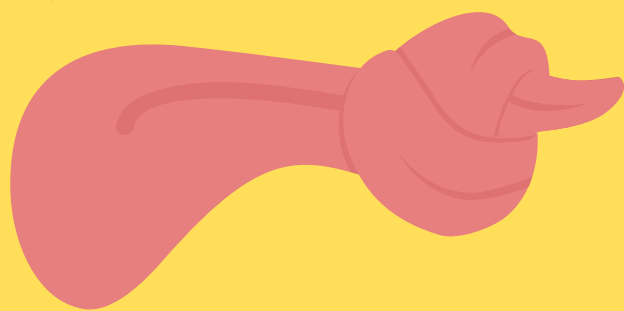


TONGUE TWISTERS!

Give papa a cup of proper coffee in a copper coffee cup



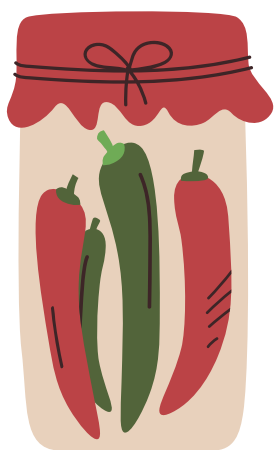
FIVE FRANTIC FROGS
